The online survey will be available in English and 10 other languages including Arabic, Greek, Hakha Chin, Hindi, Japanese, Punjabi, Simplified Chinese, Somali, Turkish, and Vietnamese. Resources are also available in additional languages to assist parents / caregivers / guardians who speak a language other than English at home. Please reach out to your child's teacher, or the school directly for survey guides in your language.

Y E A R WOODWORK

Year 7&8 Woodwork students have been designing and constructing wooden bridges to see which one hold the can most weight class in our

Strongest Bridge Challenge. Using only 10mm x 10mm Radiata Pine and PVA glue, students were given the opportunity to use their creativity to develop some intriguing structures. Most of the bridges tested were able to hold up to 200kg+ without breaking, which is an amazing result. Well done to all students.









WODONGA TAFE AGRICULTURE STUDENTS VISIT BIODYNAMIC DAIRY FARM

A group of Wodonga TAFE (Shepparton Campus) students completing their Certificate III in Agriculture recently visited the Peterson family farm, the workplace of Josh P's school-based traineeship. The farm, owned by Mark Peterson (Josh's uncle), is a Demeter Certified Biodynamic Dairy Farm, home to around 200 milking cows.

Joining Josh on the day were fellow Nathalia Secondary College students Esther and Dylan, who are also completing the Certificate III Agriculture course.

During the visit, students were welcomed onto the property and introduced to the principles of biodynamic farming. They also toured parts of the farm, gaining valuable insights into how biodynamic practices differ from more conventional farming methods.

This hands-on experience gave students the opportunity to broaden their understanding of agricultural systems, seeing how biodynamics can support both animal health and sustainable land management.



The visit also showcased the diversity of farming approaches within the industry, encouraging students to think critically about future directions in agriculture.

Nathalia Secondary College sincerely thanks Mark and Josh for sharing their expertise and providing such an engaging and informative experience. We would also like to thank Wodonga TAFE trainers Gary Baxter and Beate Barnes, who were able to incorporate this excursion into the students' studies.

Congratulations to all students who participated—you represented our school with pride and determination. We wish our qualifiers the very best as they move on to the next stage of competition!







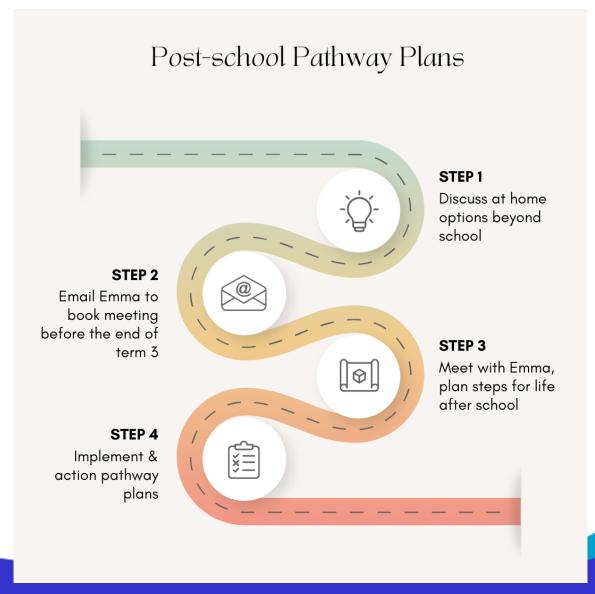


PATHWAYS SUPPORT FOR YEAR 12S

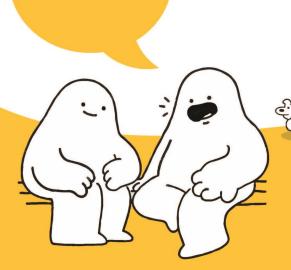

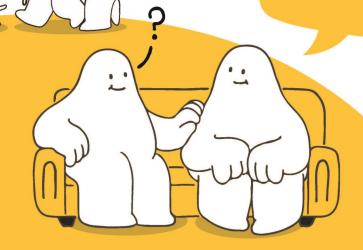


Wellbeing With Craig, Bron, Raelene & Casey



We all go through ups and downs in life. Your friends might be struggling with exam stress, a family breakdown, self-esteem, uncertainty about the future, mental health or any number of other things.

You might not be able to fix things, but one thing you can do is ask, 'are you OK?' and have regular, open conversations about what they're going through and how they're feeling.



If you think something's not quite right, that's the time to a start a conversation – you don't have to wait for them to bring it up.

If you need some tips about what to say and do during these chats, flip this over and use the 4 steps of an R U OK? conversation as your guide.

How to have an R U OK? conversation with a friend



- Choose a time and place where they'll be comfortable opening up.
- Ask in a way that works for you. You don't have to use the exact words, 'are you OK?'.
- You could even gently point out what you've noticed or mention something that's going on for them.



Listen

- Take what they say seriously and don't interrupt or rush them.
- Don't judge their experiences or reactions but acknowledge their feelings.
- Encourage them to explain by asking open ended questions like: "How are you feeling about that?" or "How long have you felt that way?".



Check in

- Set yourself a reminder to check in with them again soon.
- You could say: "I've been thinking of you and wanted to know how you've been going since we last chatted.".
- You might need to repeat the above steps.
- Your ongoing, genuine care will help them feel supported.



- Ask them what have they've done in the past to manage similar situations.
- Encourage them to think of something that could help them lighten the load.
- If they've been feeling really down for an extended period of time or they seem to be really struggling, encourage them to seek professional support.
- Offer to help them research appropriate services.
